 have behavioral challenges.
- Self Confidence- Students also rotate reading to Donald. He is a very good listener. This is a wonderful way to build fluency and give struggling readers the self-confidence they need to be successful!
- Compassion- We have many discussions about being a kind person.
 If a child learns to be compassionate toward animals odds are he/she will grow up to be a compassionate adult. Animals teach us compassion.
- Social Studies- When Donald came into our class- he did not have a name. Yes, it was election year so we had a vote on his name.
- Science- Ecosystems- Donald helps us learn about the desert environment. 5th grade students did a research project on what Donald would need to live in the desert vs. captivity.
- Math-students monitor temperature and graph temp. daily. We look for any fluctuations- when is it time to change bulb etc.

• Language Arts- Reading to Donald, Writing Donald letters, writing a journal from Donald's perspective (point of view).

These are only a few ways that Donald enhances our classroom. We all know that teachers are on a limited budget, so this would help tremendously with Donald's care.
